Expo participants - many of whom were visiting the County Museum for the first time - enioved the added benefit of being able to wander through the facility and enjoy all of the museum's rich exhibits thanks to the SBCERA Board and staff for their leadership and hard work putting this event together, and to the County Museum for allowing the use of their incredible ven-Thanks, also, to the RESBC Board members who came out to support this event and the many, many RESBC members who stopped by to chat with us. A special shout out to those of you who signed up to volunteer with RESBC!! We appreciate you.

Ok. Now that you're all caught up on the RESBC happenings in September, let's look ahead at our upcoming events and activities.

Hopefully, you are aware that

we will soon be invited to participate in an election that is deeply important to every RESBC member. Every three years SBCERA retirees elect one Retired Member Trustee and one Alternate Retired Member Trustee to the SBCERA Board. This is that year. Ballots will go out by mail and email on November 4 (so now is the time to make sure your mailing and email file addresses on with SBCERA are up to date) and must be received by 5:00 PM on **December 2**. Additional details about the election are available on the SBCERA website at https://www.sbcera.org/ board-elections.

The official candidate list for the Retired Member seats has been posted by SBCERA and Dawn Stafford, our incumbent Retired Member Trustee, was unopposed in her bid for reelection. Accordingly, there will be no election for this seat: Dawn will remain our Retired Member Trustee for another three-year term. Congratulations to Dawn, and we look forward to her continued steady and informed participation on the SBCERA Board and her unwavering representation of retiree interests.

For the Alternate Retired Member, we will be choosing from among three candidates: Gary McBride, Russell Predmore and Vere Williams. While RESBC does not endorse candidates for the SBCERA Board of Trustees, we will invite each candidate to submit a statement for publication in *PRIME TIME* so our members will have as much information as possible as we prepare to cast our ballots. Look for candidate

statements in next month's *PRIME TIME* and be sure to VOTE!

For us as retirees, another hallmark of fall is open enrollment for Medicare and County of San Bernardino County retiree benefits and, with those, RESBC's annual insurance open enrollment meeting. This event, which is intended to help our members better understand their insurance options, will take place on Monday, October 27, 2025 beginning at 10:30 AM. The presenter line-up includes County of San Bernardino Human Resources sharing information about their retiree health and dental plans, rates and enrollment timelines; local experts Scott and Sarah Welsh from Welsh Insurance Services explaining the "ins-and-outs" of Medicare: and long-time RESBC affiliate, Pacific Group Agencies (PGA) presenting the group plans (including vision and dental) available to RESBC members.

The annual RESBC Benefits Guide, which summarizes the plans and services from PGA and My Senior Health Plan, another RESBC affiliate, should start hitting mailboxes in early October, allowing ample time to review the information before our meeting. Additional details and registration instructions for the October 27 Insurance Open Enrollment meeting can be found elsewhere in this edition of *PRIME TIME*. Be sure to sign up, and I'll see you there.

Finally, as I said at the beginning of this message, Christmas will be here before we know it and, with it, the annual RESBC Holiday Luncheon. Registration is not open yet, but the event

will take place on **Monday**, **December 15**. Mark your calendar now and be on the lookout for additional details in next month's *PRIME TIME*.

The 2025 SBCERA Board of Retirement Election will take place on December 2, 2025.


Ballots for the contested seats
